**South Africa grows an
award-winning Tannat.**

Mooi Bly's Tannat was the first to be produced as single cultivar in South Africa and received an 88-points rating at Wine Spectator.

The Chenin Blanc at Mooi Bly is also a consistent favourite, scoring well on the Wine Spectator ratings.

The scenic Mooi Bly farm lies on the slopes of the Du Toitskloof Mountain in the Dal Josaphat valley on the sunny outskirts of Paarl, South Africa.

After running a specialist cheese store called "Kaashandel Vervloet" in Antwerp for 20 years, the Wouters family bought the farm in 1999. Luc and Anne-Marie, their daughter Liesbeth and son-in-law Erik Schouteden, finally settled in South Africa in 2001 after deciding that this was the best place to raise a family. Today, Liesbeth and Erik take care of

the day-to-day management of the estate's guesthouses and wine cellar, while Luc and Anne-Marie have retired to enjoy the abundant African sunshine.

Traditionally, Mooi Bly's grapes were sold to a local co-operative wine cellar, but since 1995 the farm has been producing its own wines in their cellar with great success.

"Our goal is to produce a wine that is honest and true to each variety's nature and character, made for the wine lover to enjoy." – Mooi Bly

Although not registered as a biological or organic farm, chemical sprays are kept to a minimum. Microbes are added to the irrigation water to aid composting processes in the vineyards in order to produce healthier soils, stronger vines and better quality grapes. The results are evident in the cellar.

Mooi Bly's wines consist of: Chenin Blanc, Chardonnay, Cabernet Sauvignon, Shiraz and the rare varieties Malbec and Tannat.
