Missing Virgin

Winemaker and owner Nick Gebers has an eye for detail and a passion to create. To him, art and nature are one, and his artistic abilities complement his creative approach to winemaking perfectly.

Nick's philosophy is to implement traditional winemaking methods, with the objective to interfere as little as possible with the natural process of winemaking. As such, each handpicked grape is crafted to create top quality handmade wines. Wines that are amongst the deepest and darkest in colour.

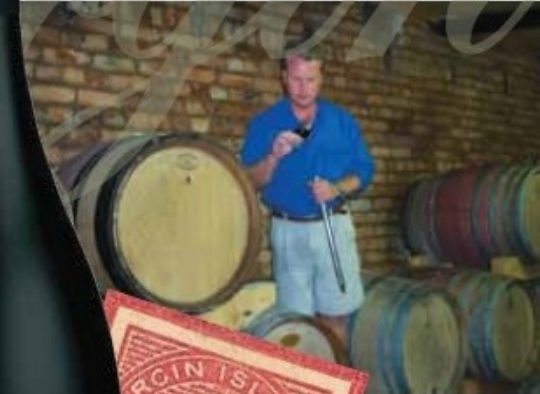
The Post House estate is steeped in history. It was originally the Raithby Post Office, which served the local missionary community of Raithby during the Second World War. The original red post box still stands on the estate and serves as the inspiration behind the names of the wines today.

Post House is fortunate enough to be situated in the Helderberg region – an area famous for producing magnificent red wines due to the slow complex ripening of the grapes.

The best grapes are those grown on terroirs that are specifically suited to that varietal.

The Penny Black (named for the famous stamp) is the flagship in the Post House wine range. It is a standout bold premium red blend that lives up to its name and delivers a deep dark colour. The Penny Black is blended with a small amount of Chenin Blanc to give it the “white in red” component. This internationally acclaimed wine has received acknowledgement from wine critics and scored 90+ points in Wine Spectator.

True to the theme of Post House, Nick Gebers has launched the new Missing Virgin wine, a blend of Pinotage and Petit Verdot. The name refers to a printing error on a Virgin Island stamp. The virgin figure was omitted from the stamp, hence the nickname, “Missing Virgin”. St. Ursula was a virgin martyr who lived between the third and fifth centuries A.D. She was born in Britain, avoided marriage to a pagan king and is believed to have been slain for her faith with 10,000 virgin companions at Cologne, Germany. Christopher Columbus named the Virgin Islands in her honour.
