Dewaldt Heyns, Winemaker

Having grown up on his father's grape farm in the Paardeberg, Swartland, Dewaldt has always had an intimate relationship with the vine.

The opportunity to hone these skills presented itself in 2004 in the form of Saronsberg, Tulbagh. This proved to be a winning combination, with Saronsberg performing constantly at the highest level, receiving numerous awards since its maiden vintage.

Apart from study trips to various wine-growing countries, Dewaldt also did harvests at Dry Creek Vineyards, Sonoma, California and Domaine Cave Yves Cuilleron, Condrieu, France.

Following his consistent successes Dewaldt was nominated and accepted as a member of the prestigious Cape Winemakers Guild late in 2007, an honour he regards as a privilege as well as a challenge to work even harder and further improve his winemaking and viticultural skills.

History

Saronsberg was purchased in 2002 as a fruit farm. Initially the plan was not to build a wine cellar but rather to spend some time gradually replanting the vineyards. Fate intervened, and two months after buying the farm, a fire swept through the estate, destroying almost all of the 100 hectares of fruit and 60 hectares of vineyards.

This misfortune forced them to embark on an extensive replanting programme, starting in 2003. The cellar construction was completed just before the 2004 maiden harvest, which commenced on 25 January, 2004.
