Stanford Hills is located on the historic Weltevrede Farm. Originally a flower farm, vines were introduced in 1998 to produce both wine and flowers of export quality.

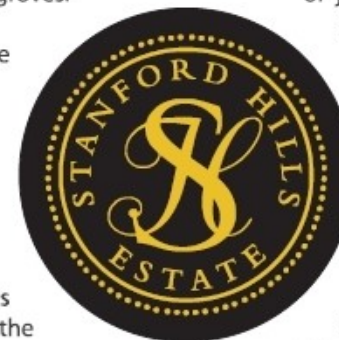
In addition to fine wine, the farm cultivates South Africa's national flower, the Protea, and bright orange pincushions. It also produces extra Virgin Olive Oil made from the fruit grown in their well-tended groves.

The estate is surrounded by the gifts of nature. Between July and November whales frolic off the Walker Bay Coast. Stanford is also surrounded by extensive nature reserves, birdlife, indigenous fynbos, waterfalls and mountains. The beauty of the area is the perfect tranquil setting for the quaint boutique winery.

Nearby is the charming town of Stanford, which has retained its old world charm with its periodic houses, wide streets, town fairs and markets.

The flagship wine is the Jacksons Pinotage. Since the first vintage of this truly South

African wine was introduced, it has become one of the most pronounced Pinotages in the country. The grapes are hand picked to ensure only the best fruit go into these hand crafted wines. The cool climate area of the Stanford mountains as well as the sea breezes ensure that the grapes ripen slowly, contributing to the smoothness of the wine. The wine has been described to have tantalizing flavours of juicy red fruit, cinnamon, plums, mulberries and hints of vanilla.



The farm was bought in 2005 by husband and wife team Peter and Jami Kastner, with partners Jaco van Zijverden and Cino Gironi. The previous owner, Maurice Jackson, had started to make very small quantities of Pinotage under the label Jacksons.

When the Kastners took over the farm they decided to retain the name, and have built on the existing brand.
